1. **Physical distancing:** Physical distancing is the most effective method to limit exposure. PPE is the least effective method and must be used in tandem with other prevention methods. Ideas include: 6 feet spacing at least, triaging outside and away from other patients, clear plastic barriers when 6 feet distance is not possible.

2. **Testing:** If tests administered correctly the false negative rate is very low. Concerns about staff not being trained properly to administer tests. Antibody testing has been stood up in several labs across WA. We still don't know what a positive anti-body test means regarding immunity. Tests being used at UW are qualitative not quantitative

- 3. **Personal protective equipment (PPE) reprocessing:** UVC and hydroperoxide both effective and a useful way to prolong N-95 stock. While PPE supply has improved, supply chains are still concerning and requests to state still outweigh the available supply. Hospital supplies vary across WA. Still need to use conservation strategies. Expecting more demand as healthcare system opens up.
