

Region's health care agencies gather for yearly convening

Olympic Community of Health will host the regional Natural Community of Care Convening June 25<sup>th</sup> in Jamestown.

**Poulsbo, WA** – The Olympic region's health care providers will gather June 25<sup>th</sup> for their second yearly convening. Olympic Community of Health (OCH) will host and facilitate the meeting, and will include representation from the region's primary care, behavioral health, and substance use disorder providers, in addition to tribal health clinics, hospitals, community-based organizations, social services, and public health officials.

What: Olympic Community of Health's Natural Community of Care Regional Convening.

When: June 25<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Where: The Red Cedar Hall at the Jamestown S'Klallam Tribal Center.

About Natural Community of Care (NCC) Convenings: NCC Convenings offer opportunities for providers to collaborate and network with the goal of improving care throughout the region. OCH's executive director, Celeste Schoenthaler, explains "The regional Convening will allow us to share knowledge and work toward OCH's collective goals of improved health in our communities. We will gather to reflect on what we have already accomplished, build and strengthen partnerships across the region, and learn from one another's successes and best practices in our shared effort toward Medicaid transformation."

About Olympic Community of Health: Olympic Community of Health is an Accountable Community of Health, one of nine in Washington State, serving Clallam, Jefferson and Kitsap counties. We are in the territorial lands of the Sovereign Nations of the Hoh, Jamestown S'Klallam, Lower Elwha Klallam, Makah, Port Gamble S'Klallam, Quileute, Quinault and Suquamish. Our purpose is to facilitate health care delivery transformation and community health improvement across the Olympic region. About the Medicaid Transformation Project: OCH is leading the Olympic region's MTP efforts. MTP aims to improve health and wellness in Washington state. It's a five-year agreement between Washington state and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). MTP invests up to \$1.5 billion in local health systems, with a focus on Apple Health (Medicaid). MTP's goals include building healthier communities through a collaborative regional approach, integrating how we meet physical and behavioral health needs so that health care focuses on the whole person, and improving how we pay for services by rewarding quality over quantity.
